RESOLUTION NO. 145-16

GOVERNING BODY CERTIFICATION OF THE ANNUAL AUDIT

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-4 requires the governing body of every local unit to have made an annual audit of its books, accounts and financial transactions, and

WHEREAS, the Annual Report of Audit for the year 2015 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with the Municipal Clerk pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-6, and a copy has been received by each member of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, R.S. 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall, by resolution, certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled “Comments and Recommendations; and

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed, as a minimum, the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled “Comments and Recommendations, as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the Governing Body no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5; and

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52, to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52: A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township Committee of the Township of Voorhees hereby states that it has complied with N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5 and does hereby submit a certified copy of this resolution and the required affidavit to said Board to show evidence of said compliance.

RESOLUTION NO. 146-16

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF VOORHEES, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF UP TO \$9,445,000 OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, SERIES 2016, OF THE TOWNSHIP OF VOORHEES; MAKING CERTAIN COVENANTS TO MAINTAIN THE EXEMPTION OF THE INTEREST ON SAID BONDS FROM FEDERAL INCOME TAXATION; AND AUTHORIZING SUCH FURTHER ACTIONS AND MAKING SUCH DETERMINATIONS AS MAY BE NECESSARY OR APPROPRIATE TO EFFECTUATE THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF THE BONDS

BACKGROUND

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Local Bond Law, constituting Chapter 169 of the Laws of 1960 of the State of New Jersey, as amended and supplemented ("Local Bond Law"), the Township Committee of the Township of Voorhees, County of Camden, New Jersey ("Township"), has, pursuant to bond ordinances 2014-248, 2014-249, 2014-255, 2014-256, 2015-261, 2015-262, 2015-263, 2015-264, 2015-265, 2016-281, 2016-282, 2016-283, 2016-284, 2016-285 and 2016-286, each duly and finally adopted and published in accordance with the requirements of the Local Bond Law (collectively, the "Bond Ordinances"), authorized the issuance of general obligation bonds or bond anticipation notes of the Township to finance the costs of certain capital improvements, as set forth in and authorized by the Bond Ordinances, all as more particularly described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, on July 30, 2015, the Township issued its bond anticipation notes of 2015, Series A, in the principal amount of \$3,668,000 ("Prior Notes"), to temporarily finance a portion of the costs of the improvements authorized by bond ordinances 2014-248, 2014-249, 2014-255, 2014-256, 2015-261, 2015-262, 2015-263, 2015-264 and 2015-265 ("Prior Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, the Prior Notes mature on July 29, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the Township has not yet issued any obligations to finance the costs of certain improvements authorized by bond ordinances 2016-281, 2016-282, 2016-283, 2016-284, 2016-285 and 2016-286 ("New Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Township to issue its general obligation bonds in the aggregate principal amount of up to \$9,445,000, as further described in Exhibit "A", the proceeds of which, together with other available funds, will be used to: (i) repay the principal of the Prior Notes at maturity; (ii) permanently finance the costs of the New Improvements for which obligations have been authorized, but not issued; and (iii) pay certain costs and expenses incidental to the issuance and delivery of the bonds (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Local Bond Law and the Bond Ordinances, it is the intent of the Township Committee hereby to authorize, approve and direct the issuance and sale of such bonds, to ratify and confirm certain actions heretofore taken by or on behalf of the Township, and to make certain related determinations and authorizations in connection with such issuance and sale.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF VOORHEES, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY, PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL BOND LAW, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to the Local Bond Law and the Bond Ordinances, the issuance and sale of general obligation bonds of the Township, to be designated substantially "Township of Voorhees, County of Camden, New Jersey, General Obligation Bonds, Series 2016" ("Bonds"), in an aggregate principal amount of up to \$9,445,000 for the Project, is hereby authorized and approved. The Bonds consist of: (i) \$7,791,000 General Improvement Bonds; and (iii) \$1,654,000 Sewer Utility Bonds.

Section 2. The Bonds shall be dated their date of delivery and shall mature on February 1 in the years and amounts set forth below:

The term of the Bonds is equal to or less than the average period of usefulness of the Project being financed through the issuance of the Bonds. Interest on the Bonds shall be payable initially on February 1, 2017 and semiannually thereafter on August 1 and February 1 in each year until maturity. The Bonds are not subject to redemption prior to their stated maturity dates.

Section 3. The Bonds shall be general obligations of the Township. The full faith and credit of the Township are irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds and, to the extent payment is not otherwise provided, the Township shall levy ad valorem taxes on all taxable real property without limitation as to rate or amount for the payment thereof.

Section 4. The Bonds will be issued in fully registered book entry only form. One certificate shall be issued for the aggregate principal amount of Bonds maturing in each year. Both the principal of and interest on the Bonds will be payable in lawful money of the United States of

America. Each certificate will be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("DTC"), which will act as securities depository ("Securities Depository"). The certificates will be on deposit with DTC. DTC will be responsible for maintaining a book-entry system for recording the interests of its participants or the transfers of the interests among its participants. The participants will be responsible for maintaining records recording the beneficial ownership interests in the Bonds on behalf of individual purchasers. Individual purchases may be made in the principal amount of \$5,000 through book-entries made on the books and the records of DTC and its participants. The principal of and interest on the Bonds will be paid to DTC by the Township on the respective maturity dates and due dates and will be credited on the respective maturity dates and due dates to the participants of DTC as listed on the records of DTC as of the fifteenth (15th) day of the month next preceding an interest payment date. The Bonds will be executed on behalf of the Township by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Mayor and Chief Financial Officer, attested by the Township Clerk or the Deputy Township Clerk, and shall bear the affixed, imprinted or reproduced seal of the Township thereon.

Section 5. The Township is hereby authorized to make representations and warranties, to enter into agreements and to make all arrangements with DTC, as may be necessary in order to provide that the Bonds will be eligible for deposit with DTC and to satisfy any obligation undertaken in connection therewith.

Section 6. In the event that DTC may determine to discontinue providing its service with respect to the Bonds or is removed by the Township and if no successor Securities Depository is appointed, the Bonds which were previously issued in book-entry form shall be converted to Registered Bonds in denominations of \$5,000, or any integral multiple thereof ("Registered Bonds"). The beneficial owner under the book-entry system, upon registration of the Bonds held in the beneficial owner's name, will become the registered owner of the Registered Bonds. The Township shall be obligated to provide for the execution and delivery of the Registered Bonds in certified form.

Section 7. The preparation of a preliminary official statement ("Preliminary Official Statement") relating to the Bonds, and the distribution of said Preliminary Official Statement to prospective purchasers of the Bonds and others having an interest therein, are hereby authorized and directed. The Mayor, Administrator, Chief Financial Officer and Township Clerk are each hereby authorized to deem the Preliminary Official Statement "final", as contemplated by

paragraph (b)(1) of Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended ("Rule 15c2-12").

Section 8. The appointment of Bowman & Company, LLP, Voorhees, New Jersey ("Printer"), to provide electronic and/or physical dissemination of the Preliminary Official Statement and Official Statement (hereinafter defined) is hereby authorized, approved, ratified and confirmed. The Chief Financial Officer of the Township is hereby authorized and directed to enter into an agreement with Printer for the services to be provided.

Section 9. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to solicit proposals for, and engage the services of, a qualified institution to serve as paying agent ("Paying Agent") and/or Dissemination Agent ("Dissemination Agent") for the Bonds. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to execute and deliver an agreement with the Paying Agent and/or Dissemination Agent.

Section 10. Pursuant to the Local Bond Law, the Chief Financial Officer ("Sale Official") is hereby authorized to sell and award the Bonds at a public sale. The sale of the Bonds shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Local Bond Law and the advertised terms of such public sale. If necessary or desirable, the Sale Official is hereby authorized to postpone, from time to time, the date and time established for receipt of bids for the sale of the Bonds in accordance with the Local Bond Law. If any date fixed for receipt of bids and the sale of the Bonds is postponed, the Sale Official is hereby authorized to announce an alternative sale date at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to such alternative sale date. The Sale Official is hereby authorized and directed to cause a summary notice of sale and a notice of sale of the Bonds to be prepared and disseminated in accordance with the Local Bond Law. At the next meeting of the Township Committee after the sale and award of the Bonds, the Sale Official shall report, in writing, to the Township Committee the principal amount, the rate or rates of interest, the maturity dates, the dates upon which interest on the Bonds shall be paid, the price and the purchaser or purchasers of the Bonds.

Section 11. The utilization of i-Deal LLC, New York, New York, to provide electronic bidding services to the Township in connection with the competitive sale of the Bonds ("Bidding Agent") through the use of the Bidding Agent's BiDCOMP/PARITY auction system, pursuant to the Local Bond Law and the regulations promulgated thereunder, is hereby authorized, approved, ratified and confirmed.

Section 12. The preparation of a final official statement ("Official Statement") with respect to the Bonds is hereby authorized and directed. Within seven (7) business days of the sale of the Bonds and in sufficient time to accompany any confirmation that requests payment from a customer, the Township will deliver sufficient copies of the Official Statement to the purchaser of the Bonds in order for the same to comply with Paragraph (b)(4) of Rule 15c2-12. The Mayor, Administrator, Chief Financial Officer and Township Clerk are each hereby authorized to execute the Official Statement, and the distribution thereof to purchasers and others is hereby authorized and directed. The execution of the final Official Statement by the Mayor, Administrator, Chief Financial Officer and Township Clerk shall constitute conclusive evidence of approval by the Township of the changes therein from the Preliminary Official Statement. The Mayor, Administrator, Chief Financial Officer and Township Clerk are each hereby authorized to approve any amendments of or supplements to the Official Statement.

Section 13. In order to assist the underwriters of the Bonds in complying with the secondary market disclosure requirements of Rule 15c2-12, the Mayor, Administrator, Chief Financial Officer and Township Clerk are each hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the Township before the issuance of the Bonds an agreement with the Dissemination Agent, providing for the preparation and filing of the necessary reports in accordance with Rule 15c2-12.

Section 14. The Township hereby covenants that it will not make any use of the proceeds of the Bonds or do or suffer any other action that would cause: (i) the Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" as such term is defined in Section 148(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("Code") and the Income Tax Regulations promulgated thereunder; (ii) the interest on the Bonds to be included in the gross income of the owners thereof for federal income taxation purposes; or (iii) the interest on the Bonds to be treated as an item of tax preference under Section 57(a)(5) of the Code.

Section 15. The Township hereby covenants as follows: (i) it shall timely file such information report or reports as may be required by Sections 148(f) and 149(e) of the Code; and (ii) it shall take no action that would cause the Bonds to be "federally guaranteed" within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code.

Section 16. To the extent not otherwise exempt, the Township hereby covenants that it shall make, or cause to be made, the rebate required by Section 148(f) of the Code in the manner described in Treasury Regulation Sections 1.148-1 through 1.148-11, 1.149(b)-1, 1.149(d)-1, 1.149(g)-1, 1.150-1 and 1.150-2, as such regulations and statutory provisions may be modified insofar as they apply to the Bonds.

Section 17. The Township hereby designates the Bonds as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" as defined in and for the purposes of Section 265(b)(3) of the Code. For purposes of this designation, the Township hereby represents that it reasonably anticipates that the amount of tax-exempt obligations to be issued by the Township during the period from January 1, 2016 to December 31, 2016, and the amount of obligations designated as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" by it, will not exceed \$10,000,000 when added to the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds.

For purposes of this Section 17, the following obligations are not taken into account in determining the aggregate principal amount of tax-exempt obligations issued by the Township: (i) a private activity bond as defined in Section 141 of the Code (other than a qualified 501(c)(3) bond, as defined in Section 145 of the Code); and (ii) any obligation issued to refund any other tax-exempt obligation (other than to advance refund within the meaning of Section 149(d)(5) of the Code) as provided in Section 265(b)(3)(c) of the Code.

Section 18. Application to Standard and Poor's Ratings Services and/or Moody's Investors Service for a rating of the Bonds, and the furnishing of certain information concerning the Township and the Bonds, for the purpose of qualifying the Bonds for municipal bond insurance, are hereby authorized, ratified, confirmed and approved.

Section 19. All actions heretofore taken and documents prepared or executed by or on behalf of the Township by the Mayor, Administrator, Chief Financial Officer, Township Clerk, other Township officials or by the Township's professional advisors, in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds are hereby ratified, confirmed, approved and adopted.

Section 20. The Mayor, Administrator, Chief Financial Officer and Township Clerk are each hereby authorized to determine all matters and execute all documents and instruments in connection with the Bonds not determined or otherwise directed to be executed by the Local Bond Law, the Bond Ordinances, or by this or any subsequent resolution, and the signatures of the Mayor, Administrator, Chief Financial Officer or Township Clerk on such documents or instruments shall be conclusive as to such determinations.

Section 21. All other resolutions, or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith are hereby rescinded and repealed to the extent of any such inconsistency.

Section 22. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption this 27th day of June, 2016.

She stated that she had hoped that he would have been so candid with his thoughts on the budget. She felt that we had so many good meetings about it. She appreciates the passion on the issue but is surprised that he voted no.

Committeeman Friedman stated that it is more than Aide to the Mayor position that he is opposed to. It's the Economic Development Director and Community Development, which to me, those responsibilities mimic the same responsibilities that were there previously. He added that the people of New Jersey are getting tired of the political patronage and we're seeing people fleeing the state in droves and this is just one of the examples why. He added that it is a problem for residents and he doesn't feel that he is alone in voicing that opinion. He stated that he does feel that Mr. DiNatale did meet with him to talk further about the position.

Committeewoman Nocito asked if there was something about budget that we weren't able to work out together. Committeeman Friedman answered that his main issue is that it is still a lot of money for this position, which is money considerably above and beyond what should be the salary and what his predecessor was earning. These residents spoke to committee regarding a large pothole on Peregrine Drive in front of their homes that when large trucks run over it, stones are being thrown into the air and could cause damage to the residents' vehicles parked on the street. Ms. Brittney stated that they were told it was going to be fixed by September and we do think it needs to be fixed before that.

Mr. Spellman stated that this road is included on the 2016 road program to be re-paved but the pothole will be taken care of before the summer.

The residents also stated that there are two speed humps located at the beginning of Peregrine Drive, but not another one until about a quarter of a mile. They spoke about concerns of speeding and the safety of the children playing outside. They requested another speed bump be installed along this road to slow down the drivers on this street.

Mayor Mignogna suggested that they speak to the chief after the meeting, who was present at the meeting.

Mr. Spellman will speak to public works about filling the pothole on Peregrine Drive.

Mrs. Connors addressed committee regarding township owned property adjacent to her property that she has maintained for the last 22 years. Mayor Mignogna thanked her. She added that there is a creek through the property and she cannot access areas that need to be cleaned and the overgrowth is obstructing the water flow. She has concerns about mosquitos and requested that the township come out to inspect and determine if there is anything that can be done to clean up the creek.

Committman Platt stated that we looked at the creek about a month earlier when a tree came down. A company was retained to remove the tree and clear the creek of any other debris in the area. He continued that the area that was addressed was closer to the Goshawk Court entrance and stated that we can expand the work to include the creek closer down to Fulmar Drive.

Mrs. Connors stated that she was just made aware of the Aide to the Mayor position being filled and wanted to understand why the position was needed and why at such a high salary?

Mayor Mignogna clarified that the position has 3 titles, Aide to the Mayor, Director of Economic Development and Director of Community Development. The aide is just one part. Mrs. Connors asked if a job description is available and the Mayor said yes.

Deputy Mayor Ravitz added that there previously was an Economic Development Coordinator in the township and we added Community Development and Aide to the Mayor. If you look at towns our size, although it is a part time job, the Mayor is at every ribbon cutting, every day, every night and it's more than a part time job to him.

Judy Hanney

Ms. Hanney stated that she does agree with the Deputy Mayor that the mayor is at a lot of events and that the Township Committee members are part time. She stated that if the mayor is too busy to attend all of the events, the Deputy Mayor should step in. She added that we shouldn't be hiring someone at over \$100,000.00 per year. She feels that the taxes are already high and our residents are struggling and many homes are in foreclosure. She doesn't feel we need a part time position and

feels that an Aide to the Mayor is not needed, that the work could be delegated between the five Township Committee members.

Mayor Mignogna stated that no one is suggesting that the Mayor's job is too much, and the job that we are discussing is not a part time job, it is a full time.

Deputy Mayor Ravitz added that the job has always been full time, one position and we have added two new jobs.

Mrs. Hanney asked what the salary was and Howard Long stated it was over \$100,000.00. Deputy Mayor Ravitz added that it was only one position at the time. Mrs. Hanney suggested that the salary and responsibilities be looked at, that maybe it doesn't have to be a full time position if committee delegated amongst themselves. She stated that a lot of her neighbors and friends have commented that they just can't afford to live here anymore because of the taxes. She thinks that the budget needs to be tightened.

Mr. Long asked Mr. Spellman how many positions we have not filled and Mr. Spellman stated that we have 28 fewer positions now than we did 6 years ago. Mr. Long added that he does have the job descriptions of the position being discussed and gave it to Mrs. Hanney. The previous employee who held the job worked full time as the Economic Development Coordinator and also did some Aide to the Mayor work. He explained that we haven't had a Community Development Director in more than 10 years and that the problem we are having is some of the large projects that come in, we are able to follow through from start to finish with a more streamlined process. We are looking to attract and increase retables. We didn't have anyone to fill that position and he doesn't want the impression to be that this is a part time position. Mrs. Hanney asked if any other things would be eliminated and Mr. Long explained again that over the last 6 years, 28 positions have not been filled after retirements or employees leaving. Several goals of the Economic Development Committee are to attract and increase retables, improve the membership of the Shop Voorhees Program, etc.

Committeeman Friedman added that his opinion it is a fallacy to say that we are now combining three part time positions into one full time position. He stated that he has been on Township Committee for six years and in his opinion, it is the same position. The prior individual maybe didn't have the same titles; all of those tasks were expected and required of that individual. The prior individual was the EDC Director and also as a Community Development Director he was the individual who put together the Summer Concert series, the Halloween in the Park with the VBA and in his opinion feels these are community development events. Being Aide to the Mayor, from his understanding, the previous employee did assist the Mayor in going to ribbon cuttings and other events taking pictures.

Mr. Long added that the Community Development Director oversees the Planning and Zoning offices completely and has nothing to do with events. It's a position that meets with developers and walks them through the process and follows up with businesses afterward and oversees the cumbersome complex laws that we have to deal with in the State of New Jersey. He clarified that the Community Development Director doesn't have anything to do with community projects, but more overseeing Planning and Zoning and added that we are down several employees in these departments.

Deputy Mayor Ravitz stated that we have a vacant shopping center on White Horse Road; Rt. 561 has a lot of vacant properties. He added that surrounding towns have positions within the town government that walk developers through the processes and helps find ways to increase business for the business owners of the town. The businesses in Voorhees could suffer if we don't have someone in the position to assist the business owners and developers. The budget also includes one million dollars in road improvements and if you look at a two year period of taxes, the increase is only 1.2%.

Mrs. Hanney said the residents will see it when they receive their tax bills in August. Mr. Long asked Mrs. Hanney if she realizes that we are only 15% of that tax bill and she stated that she is well aware of that.

Committeeman Friedman clarified that he does not disagree having the position and that he is a pro-business person, his issue was with how the position was provided. He agrees with Deputy Mayor Ravitz that it is a valuable position and one that is needed and we want to attract new businesses and make sure that the ones that are here are happy. His understanding was those responsibilities were the same under the previous Director of EDC, perhaps under a different title, but the expectation was that that person had the same responsibilities.

"Good evening, my name is Barbara Coscarello and I am a long standing resident of Camden County. I come before you tonight to express my shock and dismay over your handling of the hiring process for your Director of Economic Development, Aid to the Mayor position. Yes, I was one of the three final interviewees. I was astounded to have to have read in a local newspaper that you hired a politically connected man for this position, a man who has had very little economic development experience. I have worked for nearly thirty years in this field and for two different mayors; besides managing a mall and working as a vice president of government banking of a large bank. I am now asking you to release the resumes of the other two finalists to the public. I was astounded also at this selection, because in one of my interviews, in which at least one of your township committee members were present. I specifically asked if anyone with political connections was being seriously considered for the position. I was answered, "The most qualified person would be selected for this position". I think you remember that. I know of no other candidates for this position who had my level of experience and success in economic development and I was willing to take the job for thousands of dollars less than the person you selected. By the way, I only saw Mr. DiNatale once"

Mr. Long advised "Ma'am, I'm going to have to tell you, you are not permitted to mention anyone's name here because we haven't given that person appropriate notice tonight, so I am going to ask you please do not mention anyone by name."

Ms. Cascarello continued "By the way I only saw the winning candidate once during this interview process. I'm wondering if he attended all three interview meetings as I did. I was likewise astounded that you wasted, literally wasted, my valuable time to participate in the sham of an interview process. I am also astounded, that two weeks after this article appeared in the newspaper, I never received a communication until then. And it was a two line, thank you. Not even a phone call. Nor were my several telephone calls returned. This is hardly professional gentlemen. That would be common courtesy. I was also astounded that none of my references were ever contacted. To even learn about how highly I was regarded in both public and private agreements in South Jersey, I can only wonder why. Other professionals from Camden County, including politicians, have assured me that I am better off for not being in this position, because of the dysfunction of this administration and its lack of professionalism. I wish you good luck with your selection of this new director, because I know you'll certainly need it."

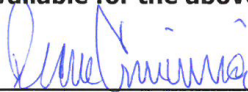

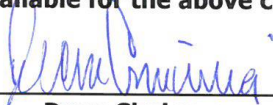
