AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE UNIFIED LAND DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF VOORHEES, TITLE XV: LAND USAGE, TO INCORPORATE A SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT STATEMENT INTO LAND USE SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

WHEREAS on May 13, 2013, the Township of Voorhees (the "Township") adopted Resolution No. 126-13, A Municipal Pledge of Support for Sustainable Land Use, and;

WHEREAS the Township finds that the public welfare will be served by assuring further commercial and civic development is consistent with the Township's desire to create a more sustainable community, and;

WHEREAS the Township desires to collect sustainable development data to inform future decisions concerning the incorporation of green design elements into municipal land usage ordinances, and;

WHEREAS the Township desires to collect this data through a Sustainable Development Statement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Voorhees in the County of Camden, State of New Jersey that TITLE XV: LAND USAGE, of the Code of the Township of Voorhees shall be amended and supplemented as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>: Chapter 156, Section 156.016 of the Township's Unified Land Development Ordinance shall be amended to add the following:

§ 156.016 SUBMISSION, CLASSIFICATION, AND COMPLETENESS OF FORMAL APPLICATIONS.

(A) All formal applications for approval, including minor subdivisions and site plans, preliminary or final major subdivisions and site plans, general development plans, change of use applications, and conceptual use plans, shall be submitted with forms provided by the Administrative Officer. The Administrative Officer shall also provide the applicant with a copy of the checklist for completeness which is contained in § Chapter 158, a copy of the environment impact statement requirements, which are set forth in § 158.04, and a copy of the sustainable development statement requirements, which are set forth in § 158.05. The completed application forms shall be accompanied by all required plans, supporting documentation, application fees and required escrow fees.

<u>Section 2</u>: Chapter 158, Section 158.02 of the Township's Unified Land Development Ordinance shall be amended to add the following:

<u>Section 3</u>: Chapter 158, Section 158.05 of the Township's Unified Land Development Ordinance shall be amended to add the following:

§ 158.05 SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT STATEMENT REQUIREMENTS

(A) Statement description. The Sustainable Development Statement is intended to elicit information on the use of various sustainable development practices in the Township of Voorhees. Completion of the statement is required for major subdivision and minor and major site plan applications. Although implementation of the statement items is encouraged, compliance is not a condition of approval unless

otherwise specified by law. The completed statement shall include full descriptive answers to all applicable items in the following list:

(1) Existing context

- (a) Description of the project site as an undeveloped, developed, brownfield, or infill location.
- (b) Description of the project site as currently served by public transit, pedestrian, or bicycle networks.
- (c) Description of the project site as currently served by rail (distance) or bus services (distance).
- (d) Description of any roads within the project site as currently meeting Complete Streets standards.
- (e) Description of the project site as currently part of a district energy or water infrastructure.
- (f) Description of the project site as currently part of a regional stormwater management system.
- (g) Description of the project site as currently integrating:
 - 1. A mix of land use types.
 - 2. Housing diversity by type and income.
 - 3. Land use densities greater than the current zoning or surrounding context.
 - 4. Historic preservation and/or adaptive reuse of existing facilities.
 - 5. Civic and/or public spaces or proximity to them.
 - 6. Recreation facilities and/or green space/parks or proximity to them.
 - 7. Local food production or opportunities for Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) or farmers' markets.
 - 8. Definable natural landscape and/or waterscape features.
 - 9. Dedicated Federal, State, and/or Municipal Open Space.
 - 10. Any association with an integrated ecological network.
 - 11. Alternative parking designs such as reduced parking ratios, a percentage of compact stalls, banked parking, shared parking, priority parking for low emission vehicles, charging stations, and/or provisions for bicycle storage.

(2) Site development

- (a) Description the site plan's provisions for:
 - 1. Minimum site disturbance during construction.
 - 2. Increased Erosion and Sedimentation Control beyond statutory requirements.
 - 3. Low Impact Design features, including, but not limited to, bio-swales, rain gardens, green roofs, pervious pavements, green walls, indigenous plant species, non-invasive plant species, low-maintenance landscaping, and onsite management of vegetative waste.
 - 4. Regenerative Design features, including, but not limited to, conservation, restoration, and/or long-term conservation management of habitat, wetlands, or water bodies.
- (b) Description of the site plan's provisions for minimizing heat island effects through reduced paving, landscaping or other methods.
- (c) Description of the site plan's provisions for light pollution reduction and energy efficient site lighting and controls.
- (d) Description of the site plan's provisions for landscape and stormwater maintenance specifications that employ integrated pest management post-bond to assure implementation for five years after occupancy.
- (e) Description of the site plan's provisions for the inclusion of public art and opportunities for civic events.
- (h) Description of the site plan's provisions for integrating:
 - 1. A mix of land use types.

- 2. Housing diversity by type and income.
- 3. Land use densities greater than the current zoning or surrounding context.
- 4. Historic preservation and/or adaptive reuse of existing facilities.
- 5. Civic and/or public spaces.
- 6. Recreation facilities and/or green space/parks.
- 7. Local food production or opportunities for Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) or farmers' markets.
- 8. Preservation of definable natural landscape and/or waterscape features.
- 9. Dedication of Open Space and/or conservation easement(s).
- 10. Alternative parking designs such as reduced parking ratios, a percentage of compact stalls, banked parking, shared parking, priority parking for low emission vehicles, charging stations, and/or provisions for bicycle storage.
- 11. A plan for promoting and educating people on green features.

(3) Construction and improvements

(a) Construction

- 1. Description of the use of Certified Green (LEED) Building criteria.
- 2. Description of the use of building orientation to maximize benefits of daylighting, view sheds, and energy and to minimize detrimental impacts on surrounding sites.
- 3. Description of the use of respect for current site scale and context in building design.

(b) Water

- 1. Description, by percentage, of the reduction in water use beyond minimum water efficiency standards set by the EPA and local government.
- Description of the use of water conservation features including, but not limited to, lowflow fixtures, waterless urinals, sensor-controlled fixtures, and/or Water Sense-labeled products.
- 3. Description of the use of rainwater, gray water, and/or storm water capture and re-use.
- 4. Description of the use of onsite wastewater treatment and ground recharge.

(c) Energy

- 1. Description of the use of energy usage reduction through efficient heating and cooling, geothermal technology, enhanced daylighting, efficient lighting, occupant controls and/or an efficient building envelope.
- 2. Description of the use of Energy Star-labeled products.
- 3. Description of the use of onsite renewable energy generation, including anticipated energy cost savings and carbon emission reductions.

(d) Indoor Air

- 1. Description of the use of natural ventilation and the efficient use of outdoor air during heating and cooling periods.
- 2. Description of any other measures being used to improve indoor air quality.

(e) Materials

- 1. Description of the construction waste management plans in place.
- 2. Description of the solid waste management plans in place.
- 3. Description, by material and percentage, of the reuse of existing building materials.
- 4. Description of the use of new building materials containing recycled content.
- 5. Description of the use of new building materials sourced within the region (distance).

(f) Social

1. Description of the implementation of indigenously inspired art in the landscape (rate of one installation per building or per residential units).

(3) General

(a) Description of any other steps heretofore unmentioned to promote green building and sustainable development practices.

Section 2: All other Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

<u>Section 3</u>: If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such subdivision, clause or provision and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

Section 4: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING TITLE V: PUBLIC WORKS, OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF VOORHEES TO MODIFY AND CLARIFY CERTAIN COLLECTION PRACTICES AND EXCLUDE THE USE OF NON-SUSTAINABLE COLLECTION CONTAINERS

WHEREAS on March 11, 2013, the Township of Voorhees (the "Township") adopted Resolution No. 92-13, A Municipal Pledge to Support Participation in the Sustainable Jersey Program, and "support a model of government which benefits our residents now and far into the future by exploring and adopting sustainable, economically-sound, local government practices,"; and

WHEREAS standard plastic bags are made from a non-renewable natural resource: petroleum, so continued and increasing use of them accelerates the depletion of valuable fossil fuels; and

WHEREAS when plastics break down, they fragment into smaller and smaller pieces during exposure to ultraviolet radiation from sunlight rather than biodegrade, allowing the remaining toxic granules to contaminate soil, waterways, and animals upon indigestion; and

WHEREAS current Township ordinances permit leaves and garden waste to be collected in plastic bags; and

WHEREAS, as the elected representative body of the Township, the Township Committee has a significant responsibility to provide leadership which will seek community-based sustainable solutions to strengthen our community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Voorhees in the County of Camden, State of New Jersey that TITLE V: PUBLIC WORKS, of the Code of the Township of Voorhees shall be amended and supplemented as follows:

Section 1: Chapter 50, Section 50.08, Leaf Collection, of the Township Code shall be amended in its entirety to read as follows:

§ 50.08 LEAF COLLECTION.

- (A) Subject to rules and regulations established by and the general supervision of the Township Committee, the Township may establish each spring and/or fall specific times during which the Township Department of Public Works will collect loose, piled leaves which are located along the curb in front of the resident's property. Any resident wishing to take advantage of this service must place the leaves in loose piles along the curb in front not more than one week before the initial day of curbside pick-up for the resident's particular neighborhood.
- (B) Leaves must be raked out to the curb and must not contain plants, branches, shrub clippings or other foreign matter.
- (C) Only leaves generated from plants and trees located on or adjacent to the resident's property can be placed along the curb for collection by the Township. Under no circumstances can leaves from property outside of the Township be placed along the curb for collection.
- (D) If the resident does not place leaves curbside for collection as provided in divisions (A) and (B) above, the leaves must be placed in sealed compostable bags or trash cans with lids and placed curbside for collection. A full bag or trashcan must weigh less than 40 pounds. Leaves may not be placed in the Township provided waste or recycling carts. In no event shall leaves be placed into non-compostable bags for collection.
- (E) The Township will issue a Notice of Violation to those residents failing to comply with the conditions of this chapter. The Township reserves the right, after due notice of violation, to remove the leaves from the curb line. The costs of this removal will be certified by the Township and shall become a lien against the property.
- (F) Nothing in this section shall be deemed to prohibit on-site composting of leaves by the resident so long as such composting is done in the rear yard area of the property and in all other respects complies

with Township codes and ordinances and the laws, rules and regulations of Camden County and the State of New Jersey.

<u>Section 2</u>: Chapter 50, Section 50.09, Garden Refuse, of the Township Code shall be amended in its entirety to read as follows:

§ 50.09 GARDEN REFUSE.

- (A) The Township will collect, on a weekly basis, one pile of garden refuse, not to exceed the volume dimensions of a trash pile which measures two cubic yards. Special hauling arrangements for garden refuse which exceed the amount and/or size set forth herein shall be coordinated with a private vendor by the resident for proper removal.
 - (B) Garden refuse shall be placed at the curb in the following manner:
 - (1) Length of material shall not exceed four feet.
 - (2) Diameter of material shall not exceed three inches.
 - (3) All materials shall be bundled with compostable twine or rope.
 - (4) Each bundle must weigh less than 40 pounds.
- (5) Loose garden refuse, including grasses, shall be placed curbside in sealed compostable bags or trash cans with lids. A full bag or trashcan must weigh less than 40 pounds.
- (6) Garden refuse may not be placed in the Township provided waste or recycling carts. In no event shall garden refuse be placed into non-compostable bags for collection.
- (C) The Township will not collect materials as listed in this category which are generated by landscapers or other contractors, or which exceeds the amount and/or size defined herein.
- (D) The Township will issue a Notice of Violation to those residents failing to comply with the conditions of this chapter. The Township reserves the right, after due notice of violation, to remove the garden refuse from the curb line. The costs of this removal will be certified by the Township and shall become a lien against the property.
- (E) Nothing in this section shall be deemed to prohibit on-site composting of garden refuse by the resident so long as such composting is done in the rear yard area of the property and in all other respects complies with Township codes and ordinances and the laws, rules and regulations of Camden County and the State of New Jersey.
- **Section 3**: All other Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- <u>Section 4</u>: If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such subdivision, clause or provision and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.
- Section 5: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF VOORHEES, TITLE V: PUBLIC WORKS, TO CLARIFY AND MODIFY CERTAIN RECYCLING PRACTICES

WHEREAS on January 27, 1986, the Township of Voorhees (the "Township") enacted Ordinance No. 307-86, establishing the "Voorhees Township Recycling Program Ordinance,"; and

WHEREAS, said Ordinance was last amended on May 14, 2007 pursuant to Ordinance No. 103-07; and

WHEREAS, the Township adopted and implemented the practice of single-stream recycling on or about March 31, 2015; and

WHEREAS the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Voorhees desires to amend said Ordinance to acknowledge and codify the practice of single-stream recycling as well as introduce a recycling education component thereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Voorhees in the County of Camden, State of New Jersey that Title V: PUBLIC WORKS, of the Code of the Township of Voorhees shall be amended and supplemented as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>: Chapter 50, Section 50.46, Recycling, of the Township Code shall be amended in its entirety to read as follows:

§ 50.46 DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this subchapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

GLASS CONTAINERS. Products used as bottles, jars and other glass containers made from silica or sand, soda ash and limestone, the product being transparent or translucent and being used for packaging or bottling of various matter or liquid, and all other material commonly known as "glass;" excluding, however, blue and flat glass commonly known as "window glass."

METAL CONTAINERS. All disposable containers made and fabricated primarily of metals such as steel, aluminum, or tin.

PAPER PRODUCTS. Products manufactured from the pulp of wood or other fibrous substances, commonly used for writing, drawing, or printing on, or as packaging material, including newspapers, magazines, paperback books, regular and junk mail, office paper and file folders, paperboard boxes, cartons, corrugated cardboard, paper bags, and paper towel rolls.

PLASTIC CONTAINERS. All disposable containers made and fabricated primarily of plastic, and having imprinted on them a recycling code of #1, #2, #4, #5, or #7.

SOLID WASTE. Includes all garbage, rubbish and waste normally collected by the township or its authorized agents.

TOWNSHIP. The Township of Voorhees in the County of Camden and State of New Jersey.

<u>Section 2</u>: Chapter 50, Section 50.47, Recycling, of the Township Code be amended in its entirety to read as follows:

§ 50.47 PROGRAM ESTABLISHED.

On and after the effective date of this subchapter and under the regulations and schedules issued by the Township Committee of the Township in accordance with the terms of this Chapter, hereby establishes a program for the mandatory preparation and placement for collection of the recyclable materials herein defined and designated in §50.49 of this Chapter, for collection or recycling by the Township or its duly authorized agents.

Section 3: Chapter 50, Section 50.49, Recycling, of the Township Code be amended in its entirety to read as follows:

§ 50.49 RECYCLABLE MATERIALS.

The recyclable solid waste materials which are required to be prepared and placed for collection by the Township or its authorized agents shall include:

- (A) Paper products;
- (B) Metal containers;
- (C) Glass containers;
- (D) Plastic containers; and
- (E) Such others as established by Township Committee ordinance.

Section 4: Chapter 50, Section 50.50, Recycling, of the Township Code be amended in its entirety to read as follows:

§ 50.50 PREPARATION OF MATERIALS.

All owners, lessees, tenants and occupants of residential properties to whom the provisions of this chapter are applicable shall prepare and place for collection the recyclable materials defined and designated in §§ 50.46 and 50.49 of this chapter in the manner hereinafter set forth:

(A) Paper products.

- (1) Paperboard boxes, cartons, corrugated cardboard, and paper bags shall be flattened before placement in the Township provided recycling cart. Oversized paper products shall be reduced into sections that fit within the cart without obstructing the dumping of its contents.
- (2) The removal of paper clips, stamps, address labels, staples, metal fasteners, cellophane address windows, rubber bands, spiral bindings, or plastic tabs from paper products is not required.
- (3) In no event shall plastic bags, twine, or other material be used to secure paper products for collection.
 - (B) Metal, glass, and plastic containers.
- (1) Used metal, glass, and plastic containers such as soup, soda, and milk containers, shall have their lids removed and be cleaned and drained free of all food and liquid or other substances before placement in the Township provided recycling cart. Loose metal lids shall also be placed in the cart.
- (2) In no event shall plastic bags or other material be used to secure metal, glass, or plastic containers for collection.

(C) Prohibited items.

- (1) The following items are prohibited from placement in the Township provided recycling cart:
 - (a) Scrap metal
 - (b) Plastic bags
 - (c) Plastic lids and caps
 - (d) Plastic six-pack holders
 - (e) Needles and syringes
 - (f) Plastic microwave trays
 - (g) Window panes and mirrors
 - (h) Ceramics and Pyrex dishware
 - (i) Plastics other than those listed
 - (j) Paint, pesticides, oils, and cleansers
 - (k) Stickers or address label sheetwaste
 - (1) Waxed paper and waxed cardboard
 - (m) Styrofoam and paper to-go containers
 - (n) Organic material and food waste
 - (o) Electronic waste (batteries, cell phones, computers, etc.)
 - (p) Such others as established by Township Committee ordinance
- (D) Recycling education.

A Voorhees Township Guide to Residential Waste Disposal and a Voorhees Township Guide to Single Stream Recycling will be distributed to residents with each Township provided recycling cart. These guides will be designed to provide information on commingled recycling, recyclable items that are

accepted through municipal collection, and how residents may dispose of other types of recyclable waste. These guides will be updated as required and posted on the Township website.

<u>Section 5</u>: Chapter 50, Section 50.51, Recycling, of the Township Code be amended in its entirety to read as follows:

§ 50.51 COLLECTION DATES.

The Township Committee shall divide the Township into districts and schedule the collection dates for each district in an effort to provide for the collection of the recyclable materials by the Township or its authorized agent weekly. The Township Committee shall be responsible for providing residents with ample publication and notice of the area of the Township included within each district and the respective dates of collection of recyclable materials for each district. Residents shall be responsible for placing their Township provided recycling cart curbside no sooner than the evening prior to their scheduled recycling collection date.

Section 6: Chapter 50, Section 50.52, Recycling, of the Township Code be amended in its entirety to read as follows:

§ 50.52 PLACEMENT FOR COLLECTION.

All recyclable materials in the Township provided recycling cart shall be placed for collection between the curb and sidewalk in front of the residence as provided in § 50.50 of this Chapter. If placement cannot be made by the resident as heretofore provided, then the Township Committee shall have the right to establish or approve another designated location on the resident's premises for the placement of such recyclables. In no event shall recyclable materials or other solid waste be placed in the street or right-of-way.

Section 7: All other Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 8: If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such subdivision, clause or provision and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

Section 9: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to https://doi.org/10.108/ unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriations and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Voorhees, in the County of Camden, finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2016 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Committee hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$712,769.82 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Committee hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove, that is not appropriated as part of the final budget, shall be retained as an exception to the final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Voorhees, in the County of Camden, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring that, in CY 2016 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Voorhees shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$712,769.82, and that the CY 2016 municipal budget for the Township of Voorhees be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to the final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,
