COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Ernie Leone 13 Devonshire Drive

Mr. Gann brought to the attention of Township Committee the issue of excessive noise. He stated that there was another event held on November 13th and although there was a lot of noise, it wasn't as bad as the previous event. He wants to know what can be done to solve this problem.

Mr. Long stated that we have received a number of police calls and other residents have come to Township Committee to voice their concerns. Our Planning Board had imposed certain conditions upon them and that potentially by congregating and making the noise in the manner that they have, based upon what our officers observed was a clear violation of those conditions. Their attorney has been contacted and advised that if it should continue the Planning Board would look to rescind their approvals. Mr. Long stated that he will follow up with the attorney to make him aware of the most recent complaints. He asked for comparison between this occasion and the last occasion and the resident said it was much better this time. He added that he is in the back of the development and can still hear the noise, and stated that it must be much worse for those who live closer to the facility.

Mayor Mignogna stated that he spoke with several representatives of the Temple, shared with them the concerns and emphasized the importance of being considerate of the neighbors. They assured him that they would be very careful about the noise. He thanked Mr. Leone for bringing this to the Township Committee's attention again and stated that we will monitor this situation very closely.

Bob Lancaster 12 Cambridge Way

He was there on behalf of himself and several other neighbors regarding noise and dust issues. A neighbor is considering having a representative from the EPA inspect an air quality test.

Mr. Long stated that silt fencing is required to be installed to help keep dirt and debris from flying off the site and the soil should be watered down regularly to keep dust to a minimum.

Doug Johnson stated that there have been meetings between Remington & Vernick and the applicant to discuss some of these issues and the applicant is working on corrective measures to ensure there isn't soil transfer from their site to neighboring sites.

Mr. Ravitz asked if the Zoning Board solicitor could send a letter to the County Soil Conservation office asking for the net fencing to be installed. Mr. Long will reach out to him, and added that the township has shut down the project until necessary safeguards are in place and that they are constructing in a manner that is appropriate with the approvals that were granted.

Mayor Mignogna stated that on September 13, 2016, a 15 year old juvenile had his bicycle stolen from the Dunkin Donuts on Burnt Mill Road. Investigator Perez identified the perpetrator who was charged with the theft. Investigator Perez was so moved by the story of the young victim that he started a Go Fund Me page on his off time to raise enough money to buy this young man a new bicycle. Mayor Mignogna and Township Committee present Officer Perez with a commendation and thanked him for everything he did to help the young victim.
